Dear Parents/Caregivers Kia Ora Tatou

This week we finished the round of community consultation evenings and it has been great to get out and meet with parents and caregivers to discuss what the school is doing well and what we need to develop. On behalf of the Board of Trustees I would like to thank the parents who gave up their time to come out and meet with me and members of the Board. The information that you have provided is invaluable and will support the future developments for South Otago High School.

As I met with parents I have reflected upon some of the changes during the last four, nearly five, years. By comparison with the feedback from parents after the previous community consultation, we have seen a significant positive shift in the feedback that we have received. There are still new challenges ahead but it is good to know that the community is behind the changes that we have made.

One request that has come through is to be kept informed with the opportunities that are offered to students. These opportunities are advertised in the daily notices for students. A copy of the daily notices is also viewable on the school portal so parents are able to see the wide variety of opportunities that are offered to students. Students can also access the daily notices in the same way too.

Another item that was discussed was uniform and at the next Board of Trustee meeting next week I will be seeking a review of the current uniform expectations. I expect that any changes will be presented for consultation with the community. Once confirmed, significant changes will have a transition period and this will be communicated to our school community. I encourage parents/ whanau to have input into the future of the uniform development.

A move to Covid-19 Alert Level 1

We are looking forward to next week and are hopeful that we will be moving to Alert Level 1 which will ease restrictions for us as a school for events where we may have our outside visitors in school, hosting of large events and be able to return to full school assemblies.

This year has taught us to try to prepare for the unexpected. We have already started our planning for Prize Giving and the Year 13 Graduation Dinner. Whilst we hope that these events are able to go ahead as we would under normal circumstances we are considering contingency plans as we know that this year is far from normal!

Cultural competition

On Thursday we did manage to hold our annual cultural competition albeit under a very different organisation. This year we had to use two venues to provide for social distancing and whilst this did not create the same atmosphere as a whole school event it was still an opportunity for students to lead their houses in an activity which has grown in significance and pride for the school and students.

It is disappointing that we do have a minority of individuals who do not attend and we note this as a higher than usual day of absence. These students not only miss a great event but also 4 hours of quality learning.

Wellbeing surveys

As part of our drive for improvement we are conducting a survey with all students on Monday 21 September which will focus on wellbeing. The survey is designed by the New Zealand Council for Education Research (NZCER) The information provided by students is anonymous and will support some of our future developments for student wellbeing

Jobbortunities

Last week I mentioned a new initiative, Jobbortunities, which has been launched to encourage young people into some of the seasonal work over the summer break. Y12 and 13 students have met and learnt about the opportunity to meet employers on 1 October between 4 and 7pm at the Cross Recreation Centre. I encourage students who are looking for work and to earn money over the summer break to make sure that they pop along to the event and make sure that they meet some of the people looking for workers this summer.

Uniform

We have a number of students who have a number of facial piercings and are wearing nose rings in particular. Under the current requirements these are not allowed. Whilst we understand that some students may choose to get these piercings done it should be timed so as not to interfere with the requirements for school. In the future students can expect to be spoken to and asked to remove these piercings. Support from families and whanau is appreciated in upholding the school expectations. Whilst this may be a consideration for the uniform review until such changes are confirmed we expect all students to comply with the current expectations which parents agreed to on enrolment.

Finally

With the end of term fast approaching I do expect to have a calm finish to the term. We do have a number of events coming up such as:

I do expect that students will take advantage of these opportunities by participating and support each other as we finish the term. For students who need support with their studies as they prepare to finish courses, next week is the time to discuss with subject teachers how they can access help to improve their studies.

This is the practice examination timetable for the 2020 senior practice examinations. We have moved the timing of these slightly later into the year so that they are closer to the real NCEA examinations and will provide better preparation. We have high expectations that students take these seriously and work diligently towards them.

Our exam week also includes workshops. These are an opportunity for students to complete work on their internal assessments. Teachers will inform students if they are to attend these workshops or not and it is an expectation that they do so. If there is a clash between a workshop and an examination students are to attend the examination.

If students have a clash, where they have more than one examination at a time or they miss an examination they will complete the examination at the next available time or on the Friday morning "catch up" session. If there are any issues see Mr Scarth and alternative arrangements will be made where appropriate.

If a student does not have a workshop or an examination they are expected to be revising or completing internal assessments at home on study leave.

Exam information

- Mr Scarth will call students into the Hall before the exam starts so students need to be at the front of the school 15 minutes before their exam starts.
- Students need to have their calculators, pens, pencils and other materials in a clear plastic bag.
- No mobile or electronic devices are allowed into the Hall so students need to think about the devices they bring to school.


