NCEA Call backs

This week deans and senior leaders have been looking at senior student results for NCEA to determine which students will need additional support beyond study leave on 11 November in order to complete their NCEA certificate or achieve their goals for the year. Next week students will learn who will be required to attend school to complete their qualifications for 2020.

Teacher only Day

Earlier this year the Government mandated teacher only days to support the changes for NCEA which are due to be rolled out over the next few years. Due toCovid-19 the first of these was cancelled this year. However, on 17 November the staff at South Otago High School will be engaged in professional development to support the changes to NCEA. There will be no classes running on this day and teachers will not be available to assist students with exam preparation.

Rugby Awards

On Thursday evening I had the pleasure of attending the inaugural South Otago High School Rugby Awards. It was a pleasure to see so many of the volunteer coaches and managers alongside parents and students attending the event. I am so proud that we are able to welcome these players into our teams and provide an opportunity for them to participate in our national game.
