Dear Parents/Caregivers Kia Ora Tatou

The term is going by so fast and next week we will farewell most of our senior students as they depart for study leave in preparation for the NCEA external exams. Whilst we acknowledge that not all senior students will have external exams we do expect that senior students will manage their time appropriately.

In a couple of weeks the Year 9 and 10 students will also be sitting their end of year exams. It is important that even though it is nearly the end of the year there is still work to be done. The holidays do not start until the end of the day of Friday 4 December. Until then we do expect that students continue to work and conduct themselves in an appropriate manner.

NCEA Call backs

Each year we ask senior students who are at risk of not achieving to continue to attend school to ensure that they attain the last few credits in order to gain their NCEA certificate or their goal to allow them to move on to the next step in their education or employment. This year we have just 29 students on call back. This is a continuation of reduction on the numbers of students needing to be called back. I believe that some of the changes that we have made to put students in control of their learning have supported this reduction. It is especially pleasing that we have so few this year after the disruptions due to Covid-19.

Vaping

This week the Ministry of Education have directed that schools become Vape free places. As a school we will have some changes to make. Below is a quote of some of the important aspects the Ministry of Education is expecting schools to adhere to:

The Smokefree Environments and Regulated Products (Vaping) Amendment Act 2020 commences on 11 November 2020, amending the Smokefree Environments Act 1990 and renaming it to the Smokefree Environments and Regulated Products Act 1990......

From 11 November 2020, the existing prohibition on smoking at schools is extended to include vaping.

We would ask that visitors to school respect these changes and do not use vape devices on any part of the school grounds.

In the future there will be new signage about our school to reflect these changes.

If students are found with vape devices or products in school they will be managed through the school discipline system. The vape devices/products will be placed in the school safe and parents will be asked to collect the items.

Teacher only Day

Earlier this year the Government mandated teacher only days to support the changes for NCEA which are due to be rolled out over the next few years. Due to Covid-19 the first of these was cancelled this year. However, on 17 November the staff at South Otago High School will be engaged in professional development to support the changes to NCEA. There will be no classes running on this day and teachers will not be available to assist students with exam preparation.

Uniform

With the end of the year approaching some student uniform items are wearing thin! Please support the school by either making the clothing last the final few weeks or accepting some of the loan items that the school has. Shoes in particular are a significant challenge as I realise the expense and that feet are likely to grow over the Christmas break! Again we do have some loan shoes and encouraging students to use these is a help to us.

Student Council

This year the Student Council have worked and lead the students under exceptional circumstances. During the lockdown they took the initiative and endeavoured to connect with students. They have organised events and activities and for ANZAC Day produced a video which was unique and inclusive. The Council has been exceptional and I am looking forward to taking them out for lunch next week to say thank you for their work during the year.

Finally

Next week the seniors will have their last day. As in previous years we know that departing students will be in high spirits. We expect that departing students will leave with a lasting positive impression and so will ensure that they are self managing and do not cause upset. On 11 November I look forward to celebrating the senior student achievements for 2020 at our senior prize giving event. I hope that all parents of senior students will be able to attend to acknowledge the achievements of our students.

NCEA Exams

Admission slips

On Wednesday students were given their admissions slips for the exams. Please encourage them to keep these in a safe place as not only do they have their personal exam timetable on them, they are also needed to get into the exam room. These should not be written on. Mr Patterson (our Exam Centre Manager) reiterated this when he met with them on Tuesday to go through exam expectations.

Digital exams

Some of our history and English students are sitting the exam digitally. Their teachers have spent time with them this week making sure that they can log into NZQA, which is how they will be accessing the exam this year. Please check with students that they are able to do this; there have been a couple of students who have experienced hiccups and need to get in touch with NZQA to reset their account (we cannot do this through school).

Covid-19

NZQA have firm guidelines for running exams safely in light of COVID. This includes students sitting at least 1.5 metres apart from each other. Any student who is unwell with cold or flu-like symptoms should not attend the exams. Under Level 1, 2 or 3 we can apply for a derived grade. We would need confirmation from a medical practitioner that the student is displaying COVID-19 symptoms as part of our application process, or the results of a COVID-19 test. We generally use exam results for our derived grades.


